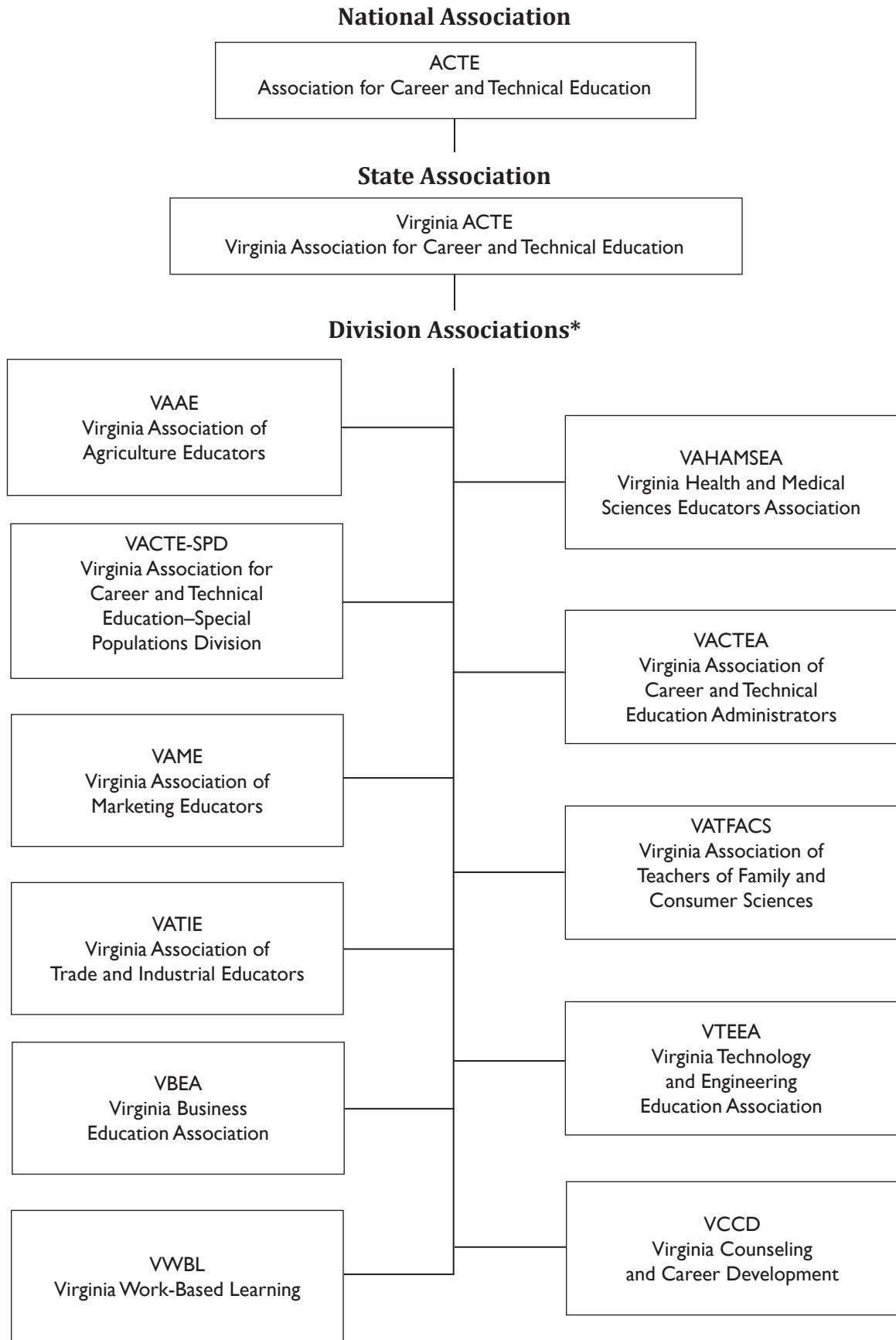
Virginia ACTE Past Presidents
